WHO WE SERVE



Urban League of Philadelphia serves underserved communities in the Greater Philadelphia area. The community members we engage with receive digital literacy training, are assisted through our career centers, and given opportunities to thrive and reach their full potential.

OUR IMPACT STORIES

A Ready2Work participant in our first cohort of 2023 who initially had no digital literacy skills. After gaining proficiency in Microsoft Office, Windows, Information Literacy, and digital Career Search Skills through our digital literacy platform, Robert developed an interest in technology. He was introduced to Hopeworks, one of our employer partners, which connects young adults to opportunities where their technology skills serve enterprising businesses. At Hopeworks, Robert learned coding, website design, and digital marketing skills, landing an internship at a tech company. After completing his internship Robert was offered a full-time position at Truist Bank as a Universal Banker with a life-building salary and benefits package.

A standout participant in the Spring 2024 Ready2Work cohort, Taekoa excelled in the professional development course and recently completed our Path to Power program through our Urban Tech programming, a 6-month data analytics scholars program designed to elevate careers through skills and certification in a high-demand field. Taekoa received a full-time job with the City of Philadelphia with the assistance of our program.

The Urban League's Ready2Work program is a shining example of our commitment to comprehensive workforce development. Individuals aged 18-34 have received intensive training and skillbuilding, preparing them for diverse professional roles. By empowering participants to achieve economic independence, we are catalyzing transformative change and fostering a more equitable, prosperous future.

Out4Good Re-Entry Program

The Urban League of Philadelphia's Out4Good initiative continues to provide impactful pre-release programming within the Philadelphia Prison System, specifically at PICC, RCF, and CFCF facilities. Grounded in holistic and evidence-based frameworks, Out4Good addresses the multifaceted challenges faced by individuals transitioning from the criminal justice system, ensuring a stable foundation for long-term community reintegration.



We work to remove barriers to employment, especially for those affected by the stigma of a criminal record. Many employers hesitate to hire individuals with past convictions, which is why we push for policy reforms like 'ban the box.' We're also tackling education and skill gaps, offering training aligned with industry needs to ensure participants are ready for the job market.
